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NOTE

To qualify for the Bachelor of Commerce, a candidate must obtain an aggregate of at least 68 credit points which must include: (a) at least 38 credit points in units at 200 level or above; (b) at least 18 credit points in commerce designated at 300 level or above. These 18 credit points must include a coherent study approved for this degree.

To qualify for Associate Membership of the Australian Institute of Banking and Finance students should include MKTG101 and BBA102 in their program.

Students satisfying the above degree requirements will graduate with a Bachelor of Commerce degree.
